- Shrosis bulbiferis Raf.—Leontodon bulbosuma Rob. p. 425. Robin says it resembles the preceding, but differs by the perianth without calicule and the simple down: bulbs white, small, hard and bitter.
- 178. Lactuca elongata Wild. Pursh.—Laitue à feuilles de Chene Rob. p. 426. Stem over seven feet high.
- 179. Lactuca fistulosa Raf. Foliis sessilis, runcinatis, glabris, glaucis crassis, caule pedunculisque fistulosis Raf.—Laitue 2. Rob. p. 425. Two feet high, flowers large, numerous; the hogs are very fond of it; it is possessed of a medium quality between Lettice and Chicory. Grows at Atakapas.
- 180. Troximon odoratum Raf. Hispidum, ramis fastigiatis, foliis sessilibus ovato-oblongis acutis integris ciliatis scabris, floribus racemosis nudis, perianthis pilosis 8 partitis, sub 12 floris Raf,—Chicoracée fenouillette Rob. p. 425. Stems four feet high, round milky; leaves a little thick. flowers pale yellow, sweet-scented, ligules five-toothed, anthers and stigmas very projecting, deep yellow; seeds oblong compressed striated with a thick and long down. This species together with Tr. virginicum, Tr. pallidum and Tr. bulbosum will form the genus Troximon; the other species which are acaules and with an embricated calyx, must form a peculiar genus which I shall call Agoseris. Raf. Found in woods.
- 181. Sonchus macrophyllus Wild ?-Laitron Rob. p.
