

- fibrosis bulbiferis* Raf.—*Leontodon bulbosum* Rob. p. 425. Robin says it resembles the preceding, but differs by the perianth without calicule and the simple down: bulbs white, small, hard and bitter.
178. *Lactuca elongata* Wild. Pursh.—*Laitue à feuilles de Chêne* Rob. p. 426. Stem over seven feet high.
179. *Lactuca fistulosa* Raf. *Foliis sessilibus, runcinatis, glabris, glaucis crassis, caule pedunculisque fistulosis* Raf.—*Laitue 2.* Rob. p. 425. Two feet high, flowers large, numerous; the hogs are very fond of it; it is possessed of a medium quality between Lettice and Chicory. Grows at Atakapas.
180. *Troximon odoratum* Raf. *Hispidum, ramis fastigiatis, foliis sessilibus ovato-oblongis acutis integris ciliatis scabris, floribus racemosis nudis, perianthis pilosis 8 partitis, sub 12 floris* Raf.—*Chicoracée fenouillette* Rob. p. 425. Stems four feet high, round milky; leaves a little thick. flowers pale yellow, sweet-scented, ligules five-toothed, anthers and stigmas very projecting, deep yellow; seeds oblong compressed striated with a thick and long down. This species together with *Tr. virginicum*, *Tr. pallidum* and *Tr. bulbosum* will form the genus *Troximon*; the other species which are acaules and with an embricated calyx, must form a peculiar genus which I shall call *Agoseris*. Raf. Found in woods.
