

**Martinezia** Ruiz et Pavon, Fl. Per. et Chil. Prodr. 148. 1794.

Lectotype: *M. ensiformis* Ruiz et Pavon (Syst. Veg. 1: 297. 1798)  
(vide Burret, Rep. Sp. Nov. Reg. Veg. 34: 170. 1933).

The genus *Martinezia* contained five species belonging to as many genera. Martius abandoned the genus in its original mixed sense (*Hist. Nat. Palm.* 2: 5. 1823) and took up the name *Martinezia* in a new sense for species referable to *Aiphanes*, following Kunth (*Nov. Gen. et Sp. Pl.* 1: ed. fol. 245, ed. qu. 305. 1816). This error was rectified by Burret (*Notizbl. Bot. Gart. Berlin* 11: 557–577. 1932), who also typified *Martinezia* in a manner which accords with the ICBN Guide for the Determination of Types 4e (1961). *Martinezia ensiformis* Ruiz & Pavon was transferred to *Euterpe* by Martius. The last genus, as delimited by Martius, is to be proposed for conservation against *Martinezia*.

**Microcoelum** Burret et Potztal, Willdenowia 1: 387. 24 Feb 1956.

Lectotype: *M. Martianum* (Glaziou) Burret et Potztal, nom. illeg.  
[*M. Weddellianum* (H. Wendland) H. E. Moore].

*Microcoelum* includes the illegitimate *Glazioua* Martius as a generic synonym. No type was indicated. In selecting a type, it is logical to designate the same species as that chosen for *Glazioua*—i.e., *Microcoelum Martianum*. This name, unfortunately, is also illegitimate, since the earlier and validly published *Cocos Weddelliana* was cited as a synonym. When *Microcoelum* is accepted as a genus, the type species should bear the following name:

**Microcoelum Weddellianum** (H. Wendland) H. E. Moore, tr. nov.

**Normanbya** F. Mueller ex Beccari, Ann. Jard. Bot. Buitenzorg 2: 91, 170, 171. 1885.

Lectotype: *Cocos Normanbyi* W. Hill [*Normanbya Normanbyi* (W. Hill) L. H. Bailey].

The generic name *Normanbya* has been considered by Dammer (*Ber. Deutsch Bot. Ges.* 21: 91–98. 1903) and by Pichi-Sermolli (*Webbia* 11: 83–84. 1955) but both the validity of the name and its typification appear to require further comment.

*Normanbya* first appeared as a provisional name used by von Mueller in the discussion of *Ptychosperma Normanbyi* (W. Hill) F. Mueller (*Fragm. Phyt. Austral.* 11: 57, 1878: “legibus plurum monographorum illustrium Ptychospermati Normanbyi positio generis seorsa [tunc Normanbya] assignaretur...”). It is therefore not validly published under ICBN
